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BEIJING (CHN) SECURES FOUR-YEAR DEAL TO HOST UIPM OBSTACLE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS (OCR)



- Chinese capital to host new global competition from 2025-2028
- OCR specialists and pentathletes poised to race on 100m, 400m and 3km courses
- President Stull celebrates 'important step in integration of urban sport'

The Chinese capital city of Beijing has won the right to host the first four editions of the UIPM Obstacle World Championships (OCR), securing the competition from 2025-2028.

The brand-new World Championships, set to launch in October 2025, will be UIPM's first step into the organisation of standalone Obstacle competitions. The organising committee has offered significant prize money and UIPM will invite the most successful Obstacle athletes from both Pentathlon and OCR communities.

The competition will be hosted within the sports complex originally designed for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games, which has since been heavily modernised and upgraded.

Hundreds of athletes from the Obstacle and Pentathlon communities are expected to travel to Beijing (CHN) to test their skills in Obstacle Course Racing (OCR) courses spanning 100m, 400m and 3km.
