Discussions included modern pentathlon development and development programmes, tapering for competitions, fencing skills, the importance of basic flatwork skills when jumping and techniques on getting to know an unfamiliar horse.

Commenting in the quality of this year's speakers, Jan said: "There has been a fantastic balance of speakers and there are people here who will appeal to a wider audience. We have coaches from grass roots in the sport to coaches at elite level and the content covered most of the areas that are appealing for everybody."
